Well as I mentioned in my last Grace for Today article, the season of waiting for a spectacular event, ADVENT, was upon us. I shared in that article that I would be waiting with excitement for a special birth much like we all do in Advent. But in my case, I was awaiting the birth of my second grandson. Well the waiting is over! On Sunday, December 10 at around 3:30 in the morning, Odin Ryan Schindler came into the world a healthy happy 9.5 pound baby boy. All are doing well, including older brother Lukas who is completely thrilled at the reality of being a big brother. The season of Advent this past year will always be special one in my life and for many reasons.

The reality of a birth bringing forth good news and heralding an end to waiting is truly what Advent is, and was always about. THE ZIMBELSTERN- WHAT IS IT?- This delightful gift that combines the sound of bells with the movement of a star is now perched on the ledge surrounding our organ pipes. If you were at the Christmas Eve 4:30 & 11 pm services you heard the tiny bells that carry over the sound of the organ and saw the lovely bronze twirling star. Zimbelstern means cymbal-star, originating in German in the 18th century. Originally the bells were attached to the star and struck by stationary clappers. These cast tuned bells are unique in that they blend with any harmony played on the organ. The pitches for the five individual bells were chosen to not produce a particular "key" (tonal center) or to clash with each other. They are high enough in range to be heard over whatever the organ is playing. Special strikers create a brighter sound than handbells so the sound is more distinct. The bells are rung in a random sequence of sixteen notes over the five bells which does not sound repetitive. The speed and volume of the bells can also be adjusted to fit the music being played. We thank this generous donor and look forward to the many occasions on which we will be uplifted by this sight and sound.

CHRISTMAS FAMILY SHARING- A huge thank you for your generous support of the Christmas Family Sharing ministry this year. With your help we donated, seven boxes of food, two boxes of medications and other supplies, and \$280 in gift cards to the Family Health Partnership Clinic. We donated three boxes of supplies, lots of laundry baskets, and \$650 for weighted blankets to Turning Point shelter program. And, we donated (there might be a song in here somewhere) 17 chicks, 9 pigs, 6 hives of honeybees, 6 water filters, 5 roosters, 5 goats, 5 sets of school supplies, 4 meals for refugee families, 4 school fees and uniforms, 3 Bibles, 3 feeding 50 at a soup kitchen, 3 microloans for a woman, and 1 latrine to ELCA Good Gifts.
